- Official members: nominated by Member States; typically ministry of sport officials
- Observers: sport stakeholders and representatives of the European sport community; e.g. EU office of the European Olympic Committees, UEFA, FIFA, FIA, FIM, FESI, EuropeActive, UNFCCC, European Environmental Agency, etc.

# **Objectives**

- Identify key sustainability opportunities and challenges for the European sport sector
- Help define the subject of green sport in Europe: scope and participating sectors, stakeholders and audiences.
- Promote environmental sustainability *in* the European sport sector; and *through* the power of sport.
- Provide simple, high-level guidance to <u>help Member States align their sport sectors</u> with the objectives of the European Green Deal.
- Make recommendations to support sport decision-makers in Members States; European and national sports bodies.
- Highlight existing relevant initiatives and provide good practice examples and further reading for European sports practitioners.





### Examples of topics covered

#### Sustainable sport infrastructure

- Maintenance (energy management); renovation; construction;
- Impact of climate change on sport infrastructure





#### **Sustainable sport events**

- Provides concrete ways event organisers can make more sustainable sports events, covering the main aspects that cause sport events to damage the environment; e.g.: transport and mobility; waste (reduction and management); catering (organic and local) etc).
- Provides policy makers and authorities with suggestions to facilitate change.





#### **Innovative cross-sectorial solutions**

- focus on <u>how different sectors relate to each other and can contribute to mitigating and reducing</u> <u>the negative impact of sport on the environment</u>, climate, and biodiversity, by working together in an innovative manner.
- Identify the main external (e.g. public authorities, NGOs, etc) and internal stakeholders (sport community) involved and
- Elaborate potential for closer collaboration across different stakeholders, with concrete suggestions





#### Capacity building, education and promotion of sustainable sport practices (including the sport movement's contribution to the European Climate Pact)

- Capacity building, across the sport movement (federations, clubs, incl. private sector)
- Education: coaches education (e.g. in outdoor sports) and university curricula
- Using the fascination and reach of sports/athletes as a driver for green change: environmental sustainability through sport
